

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Question: What is His Hope Recovery Residences?

Our recovery residences are safe, affordable, and Christ focused living environments for men who have been sober for at least 30 days. Men living in the residences have access to support groups, peer support, mentoring, counseling, employment opportunities, and life skills classes.

2. Question: How long can someone reside at His Hope Recovery Residences?

We offer a resident driven length of stay. Our core residential program is approximately 9 months but residents often choose to stay longer because they want to continue their recovery in our safe Christ focused community.

3. Question: How much does His Hope Adult & Teen Challenge Cost?

His Hope Recovery Residences are **FREE** to enter and **NO** insurance is needed.

4. Question: Does His Hope Recovery Residences work with teens?

We serve men ages 18 and up. Although we do **NOT** work with teens, many Adult & Teen Challenge centers do. To find a center nearest you who does work with teens, visit TeenChallengeUSA.org/centers.

5. Question: Can I work while in His Hope Recovery Residences?

Yes, men begin working in Phase 2 of the ministry which is normally between 14-30 days.

6. Question: Are His Hope Recovery Residences lockdown facilitites?

No, we take residents in on a voluntary basis.

7. Question: Who can visit me when I am in His Hope Adult & Teen Challenge?

While in the program, residents may only have contact (visitation, phone calls, letters, passes) with "healthy" people who are on their "Approved Contact List". No one on the Approved Contact List may be a current drug or alcohol abuser and must be a positive influence on the resident.

8. Question: When and how often can someone go on weekend passes?

Phase 1 (first 14-30 days): One family visit. No weekend passes

Phase 2 (4 months): One weekend pass a month Phase 3 (4 months): Weekend passes twice a month

Phase 4: Passes every weekend

9. Question: Can I write and receive letters while at His Hope?

Yes, you may write as often as you wish and receive mail from anyone on your Approved Contact List.

10. Question: Can I bring my cell phone?

Yes, you will be able to use phones during scheduled designated time periods.

11. Question: Can I get my GED while in His Hope Residences?

Yes. Individuals will be encouraged to get their GED.

12. Question: Can I take Suboxone, Methadone, narcotic pain medications, or narcotic-like pain medications while living at His Hope?

No

13. Question: Can I keep my car on His Hope property while in the ministry?

Yes, residents can seek approval to have their own vehicles once they are in phase 3

14. Question: Is it necessary for me to believe in God to be accepted into His Hope Recovery Residences?

No, however we do ask for residents to have an open mind to matters of faith since we are a faith-oriented community.
